- b. ACDC emergency small business relief
 - i. Micro businesses (less than 500 employees) out of business or partially out of business for 6 weeks now. Federal money is still not flowing to small businesses. Asked Innovia Foundation for a one time grant through their COVID-19 fund for us to create this fund. Economic disaster recovery is a mission for ACDC. Innovia requires a local match, of which the executive board is proposing moving \$10,000 from our savings account to use as that match. Seeking additional funding. Ultimate goal to establish \$75,000 war chest to offer a \$1500 grant to small businesses in Adams County.
 - ii. WWSB grants became available Tuesday and Adams County is only earmarked for \$79,000. So far we have 37 applicants asking for nearly \$400,000. This fund will barely touch a handful of businesses.
 - iii. Board discussion regarding moving \$10,000 (action)

 - a. Highlighting outreach due to COVID-19. Business Impact Survey & processing Working WA Small Business grant applications.
- 9. Adams Co Activity Stephen McFadden.
 - a. Email notification this afternoon that McCain Foods has halted construction on their expansion project, due to COVID-19. Deemed essential business by the Governor but the virus has impacted the project and temporarily shut down construction.
