- c. Lind Paula Bell. Construction & water lines are main focus in town. New main lines for water, includes new valves. New service lines to residents on 7<sup>th</sup> Street and meters. Weather is cooperating so far with construction. Jamie Schmunk. Chamber is having annual Christmas parade. Two plans lighted parade 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in December. Either people watch from their cars, or parade route travels through town.
- d. **Washtucna** Lloyd Stoess. Sonny's is closed and for sale. Washtucna Fire Dept. did Halloween hot dog feed at the fire hall & had a great turnout. Family's social distanced and they served 100. All 57 windmills are up and about a dozen are now running.
- e. Adams County John Marshall. Working on the budget, getting close to advertisement for hearing. Talked to Salazar, Central WA rep for Governor's office to ask the governor to not shut us down again. Small business has been crippled, even large retail is suffering and we don't want to see it happen again. Election this month. Recommends Terry Thompson to take his position on the board.
- f. **Port of Othello** Deena Vietzke. Budget is approved & sent to county. Pouring concrete floor for new hanger at airport. Working with JUB engineers on water project at Bruce.
- g. Avista Ian Eccles. Othello's Lee Road, new substation on 7<sup>th</sup> & Lee, laydown yard for new transmission lines coming this next year. Ritzville has been having power blinks – birds & dust, are causing the issue. Crews are replacing 80+ miles of insulators because of the issue.
- h. Columbia Basin Railroad no report.
- Coulee Corridor Ken Caylor. Working on getting paperwork done for grant money for 2021. Working with Grant County Tourism on funding. Trying to finalize projects. Received money from Othello. Electric City & Grand Coulee to come. Federal Grant

paperwork to close out Kiosk projects.

- j. Ice Age Floods Lloyd Stoess. No report.
- k. BBCC Bryce Humphreys. Updates: uptick in positive COVID cases with students, taking up more of the time to keep everyone safe. WA State board of tech colleges, working on accreditation approval with new bachelor's program. October regional accreditation visit, important to secure federal financial aid for students. Nursing program received program accreditation also. Continue to offer courses online, especially while cases are increasing.
